I. BACKGROUND

Special Assistance In-Home (SA/IH) policy has been updated to reflect an increase in the federal poverty guidelines effective April 1, 2012. SA/IH budgeting has not changed. Administrative Letter 12-03 explains procedures to apply to SA/IH cases for applicants and recipients that may be affected by this increase.

SA/IH policy has also been updated to reflect the renaming of the figures to Appendices. Each link for Figures 2-11 has been directed to the appropriate appendix found in the SA/IH Case Management Manual. Figure 1 has been linked to the onlinemap of participating counties.

II. CONTENT AND IMPLEMENTATION OF CHANGE

A. SA-5000 Introduction to SA-IH Program Procedures SA-5100 Intake, Referral and Timeframes

B. SA-5200 Application Processing

<u>I. B. 2:</u> The chart has been updated to reflect the increase in the federal poverty guideline for an individual from \$908 to \$931 per month and for a couple from \$1,226 to \$1,261 effective April 1, 2012.
