## I. BACKGROUND

The 2012 <u>settlement agreement</u> between the State of North Carolina (NC) and the US Department of Justice (DOJ), requires the State of North Carolina to develop and implement effective measures to prevent inappropriate institutionalization of individuals with serious mental illness (SMI). The State also agreed to provide adequate and appropriate public services and supports identified through person-centered planning in the most integrated setting appropriate to meet the needs of individuals with SMI, who are in or at risk of entry to an adult care home (ACH). This <u>settlement agreement</u> led to the <u>Transitions to Community Living Initiative</u> (TCLI). Special Assistance In-Home (SA/IH) is one key public service available to support individuals eligible for TCLI slots.

This Change Notice obsoletes DAAS Administrative Letter 13-07.

## II. CONTENT AND IMPLEMENTATION OF CHANGE

- A. Added Section SA-5250 to the SA/IH manual. It is specifically dedicated to SA/IH eligibility and TCLI.
- **B.** This section provides policy guidance when a face-to face application is required; the importance of communication with the LME/MCO coordinators; and procedures when an individual with TCLI and SA/IH moves to another county. It encourages the income maintenance caseworkers to contact DAAS with questions.
